BISHOP TO ORDAIN TWO NEW PRIESTS FOR MAINE PARISHES

The Most Reverend Brian R. Marsh, Bishop of the Diocese of the Northeast, Anglican Church in America (ACA) will ordain two new priests who will serve parishes in the State of Maine. The Bishop will ordain the Rev. Mr. Ian Dunn and the Rev. Mr. Edward Kalish to the Sacred Priesthood at a special service at St. Paul's Church in Portland, ME on Saturday July 6th at 11:00 am.

Deacon Dunn was born July 26th, 1984 in Brunswick, Maine. He grew up in North Yarmouth, Maine. Son of Paul and Lise Dunn, he graduated from Chop Point School, in Woolwich, Maine in 2003. He attended Hillsdale College graduating in 2007 with a B.S. Degree in Biology, 2007. He also attended Bangor Theological Seminary and the Logos House of Theological Studies. He currently lives in Southwest Harbor, Maine and is Deacon-in-Charge of St. Thomas Anglican Church, Ellsworth, ME. He is also a librarian at the Logos House of Theological Studies in Ellsworth.

Deacon Kalish was born in Bar Harbor, Maine on Aug. 16, 1948. He attended the University of Wisconsin, Madison and earned an Associate of Arts Degree from Sierra College in Rocklin, CA in 1973. He received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Biblical & Theological Studies from San Jose Bible College, CA in 1975. His education continued at the Logos House of Theological Studies in the Diaconal & Priesthood Tracks. He is also a Transit Driver for the City of Bangor and a music instructor. He was ordained to the Diaconate on May 10, 2009 and appointed Deacon-in-Charge of Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Waterville in 2010. He is married to Linda Kalish and has 4 children.

“We are pleased to have these dedicated men serving parishes in Maine, first as Deacons and soon as priests,” said the Most Rev. Brian Marsh, Bishop. “We welcome these fine men into the ordained priesthood and are pleased that our seminary ranks are expanding along with our parish communities.” Both new priests will continue to serve their current parishes in Maine.
